

COMMUNITY FUNDING

2013-14

History:

- ▶ Initiated in 2000 to:
“Continue those social and community services that are needed and provide direct or indirect benefit to Goodyear residents.”
- ▶ As the city grew, focus narrowed from arts and quality of life to core human and social services;

Details:

- ▶ Applications opened in early February and closed in early April. Announcement was posted on Facebook and on the Goodyear website home page. Prior applicants were notified via email.
- ▶ Applications are evaluated based on number of Goodyear residents served, the organization's secular and financial status, and whether the service is unique in Goodyear or replicated by another local organization;
- ▶ Budget FY2013-14 = \$154,400

2013-14 Applicants:

- ▶ 25 applications submitted;
- ▶ Health & Human Services providers, including food banks, victim services, mental and behavioral health, and services for children and seniors;
- ▶ Two new applicants: Hattie Larham and Sky Kids;
- ▶ Subcommittee: Vice Mayor Pizzillo, Councilmember Campbell, Councilmember Stipp;
