Why Are Traffic Signals Installed

- Meets requirements in Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD)
 - Excessive overall delay at all-way stop
 - Excessive side street delay at two-way stop
 - Crash problems/Safety concerns



Traffic Signal Warrants


- Warrant 1 Eight-Hour Vehicular Volume
- Warrant 2 Four-Hour Vehicular Volume
- Warrant 3 Peak Hour
- Warrant 4 Pedestrian Volume (At least 93 pedestrians in peak hour)
- Warrant 5 School Crossing
- Warrant 6 Coordinated Signal System*
- Warrant 7 Crash Experience (At least 5 correctable crashes in 12 months)
- Warrant 8 Roadway Network (Two major streets)
- Warrant 9 Intersection Near a Grade Crossing (Railroad Crossing)*



*Not commonly applicable

Warrant 3 – Peak Hour Warrant

Plotted point representing vehicles per hour (vph) on major street and vph on minor street for one hour falls above applicable curve
