# History

Initiated in 2000 to:

“Continue those social and community services that are needed and provide direct or indirect benefit to Goodyear residents.”

Focus ranges from arts and quality of life to core human and social services.

## FY2014-15 HIGHLIGHTS IN THE FIRST SIX MONTHS:

- 4,400+ Goodyear residents benefited from services provided by funded agencies.
- 164 nights of lodging for homeless persons from Goodyear were provided by CASS' (Central Arizona Shelter Services) regional shelters for families and single adults.
- 12,906+ meals were distributed to Goodyear households through Emergency Food Box programs.
- 200 weekend snack sacks were delivered to children at three area schools, two of which are physically located in Goodyear.

# 2015-16 Process

---

- Applications opened April 10<sup>th</sup> and were due May 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Announcement was posted on the Goodyear website home page and on Goodyear social media. FY2014-15 applicants, members of the Faith Community Roundtable, local media contacts, and local and regional non-profit groups were notified via email.
- Applications are evaluated based on number of Goodyear residents served and whether the service is unique in Goodyear or replicated by another organization;
- Budget FY2015-16 = \$114,400

# 2015-16 Applications

- 32 applications submitted; 14 new applicants.
- Health & Human Services providers, including food banks, victim services, mental and behavioral health, and services for children and seniors.
- 25 applications advanced for funding.

<b>Catitude Gallery Studio, CGS, - A Community Arts Center:</b> to fund youth educational programming, cultural events, art appreciation/participation, and opportunities for economic development.	\$1,500
<b>Central Arizona Shelter Services, Inc. (CASS):</b> to support the general operation of CASS' two regional shelters for homeless families and single adults.	\$15,000

<b>Mission of Mercy, Inc.:</b> to provide primary care patient visits, prescription medication (if applicable), health care literacy education, and diagnostic tests.	\$5,000
<b>Southwest Lending Closet:</b> to meet the ongoing and growing demand for loaned home health equipment.	\$10,000
<b>Southwest Valley Literacy Association:</b> to increase the number of Goodyear-based tutors.	\$2,200

<b>St. Mary's Food Bank Alliance:</b> to purchase food that is not donated in sufficient quantity for Emergency Food Boxes (EFBs), ensuring that the EFBs are well-balanced nutritionally and that there is an ample inventory for agencies in Goodyear to then distribute to hungry people in need.	\$7,500
<b>Taking Turns Toybrary:</b> to streamline the lending process by purchasing a bar code/scanning system, for use in conjunction with portable technology.	\$2,000
<b>Trinity's Learning Resource Center, Inc.:</b> to promote access to the Strategies of Living Financially Free program, helping Goodyear residents improve their financial health.	\$1,000
<b>Wayne Foundation:</b> to provide opportunities for youth of all ages and abilities to play basketball with a focus on the athlete's education and encouragement to strive for higher education.	\$2,500
<b>West Valley Youth Orchestra:</b> to deliver a one-day workshop to focus students in intensive sectional rehearsals.	\$1,000
