#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Approve a request from Carolina Fuentes, owner/agent for NMCI Kids, LLC, dba Mariscos Camaron Pelao restaurant, for a new Series 12 liquor license, #1207A396, located at 350 N. Dysart Road, Suite 201 (generally located on the Southwest corner of Dysart Road and Van Buren Street).

#### **PURPOSE:**

Ms. Fuentes has applied for a new Series 12 liquor license for Mariscos Camaron Pelao restaurant, which serves Mexican style seafood. The restaurant is located at 350 N. Dysart Road, Suite 201. The applicant has paid the \$635.00 fee.

### **BACKGROUND AND COMMUNITY BENEFIT:**

The Office of the City Clerk received this application for a new Series 12 liquor license on September 18, 2015.

This restaurant opened for business in October 2013, and was issued liquor license #12079624 by the State of Arizona Department of Liquor Licenses and Control. The business recently changed ownership and the new owner is required to obtain a new Series 12 License. Marisco Camaron Pelao is not a franchise restaurant.

Mariscos Camaron Pelao restaurant is continuing operations and alcohol sales as permitted through the interim permit process, which is a conditional permit obtained through the State Liquor Board, and authorizes the holder to sell alcoholic beverages that would be permitted to be sold under the privileges of the license for which the application has been filed. An interim permit may be issued to the applicant for a license of the same series at the same premises for a period not to exceed 105 days.

A Series 12 License is for a restaurant and is non-transferable. It allows the holder of the license to sell and serve all types of spirituous liquor solely for consumption on the premises of an establishment which derives at least forty percent of its gross revenue from the sale of food.

The applicant has informed staff that all employees will complete liquor law training as required by the State of Arizona. There will be a manager who is certified in the sale of alcohol on site at all times, and staff will be trained in responsible alcohol sales and

service. All guests who appear to be under 35 years of age will be required to show valid I.D.

There are no licensed childcare facilities within 300 ft. of the location.

The application has been properly reposted for the State mandated 20-day period. Any petitions or protests pursuant to A.R.S. 4-201(b) received during the 20-day posting period will be added to this report. The applicant has submitted the proper paperwork. There is no information at this time that would prohibit the applicant from obtaining this license.

The City Council's recommendation of approval, disapproval or no recommendation will be forwarded to the Department of Liquor Licenses and Control ("Department") for their consideration. If the City Council recommendation is for approval, no hearing is required unless the Director of the Department, the State Liquor Board ("Board"), or any aggrieved party requests a hearing on the grounds that the public convenience and the best interest of the community will not be substantially served if a license is issued. If no hearing is requested, the Director may approve the license. If the City Council recommendation is for disapproval of an application, a statement of the specific reasons along with a summary of the testimony or other evidence supporting the recommendation for disapproval shall be attached to the order of disapproval and submitted to the Director and a public hearing will be held.

If the City Council recommendation is no recommendation, the Director may cancel the hearing and issue the license unless the Board, or any aggrieved party, protests and requests a hearing. If the reason for the protest is clearly removed or deemed satisfied by the Director, the Board shall cancel the hearing and the Department may issue the license. The application has been routed to Police, Fire, Code Enforcement, and Community Development. (Attachment A)

The completed application is on file in the office of the City Clerk.

#### **FISCAL ANALYSIS:**

The applicant has paid a \$635.00 application fee per the Goodyear Municipal User Fee Schedule. This business will contribute to the tax base of the community.
