




WIN-WIN



- Maricopa County will convey the basins, totaling 129.2 acres, to the City of Goodyear
 - Nominal cost of \$233
 - Closing costs estimated at \$10,000.
 - Paid out of the \$75,000 budgeted for the park master plan in the Fiscal Year 2016 budget.
- City assumes all maintenance, estimated at \$35,000 ongoing annually
