



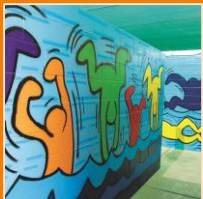

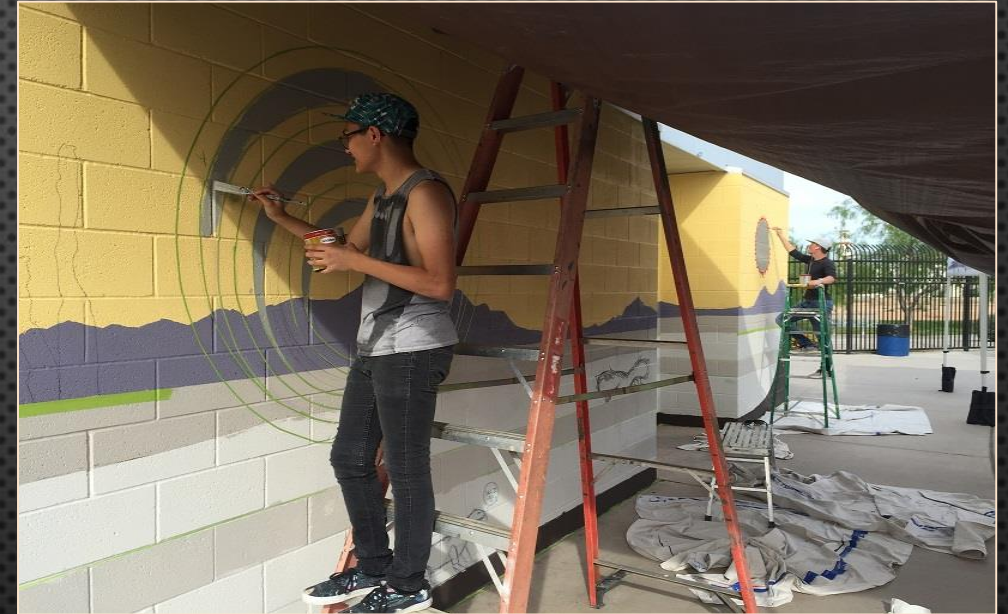

- Goodyear Community Park- \$20,000
 - Add Artwork to High Traffic Area
 - Engage Community in Process
 - Beautify Stage Area

FY18 Public Art: Traffic Cabinets

- Pilot Cabinet Beautification Program- up to \$3,000 per cabinet
 - Up to five cabinets
 - Applied Artwork (wrapped or painted)
 - Community Participation in Art Development
 - Strategically Identify Potential Installation Sites
 - Utilize Traffic Signal Asset Management Program

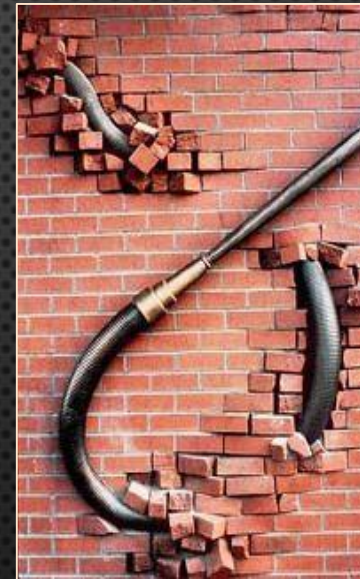
