SUBJECT: Intergovernmental Agreement with Maricopa County for exchange of services.

PROPOSED ACTION:

Authorize the City Manager or designee to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with Maricopa County for exchange of services. (Luke Albert, City Traffic Engineer)

BACKGROUND AND PREVIOUS ACTIONS:

The Entente Agreement between Maricopa County and the City of Goodyear was approved by City Council (COAC 13-4958) on January 28, 2013, and remains effective for five years. This agreement allows staff from the city and Maricopa County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) to exchange maintenance services of equal value. It also allows the city and MCDOT to partner on shared projects and allow one agency or the other to serve as the lead on shared projects.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

For the past four fiscal years, the city and county have entered into letter agreements to exchange city street sweeping services on county streets for county grading services on city streets. The benefit to the city is increased efficiency and productivity of the services each agency currently performs. MCDOT performs services such as grading full time because they have the equipment and personnel to perform this service, and they grade county areas daily. They also have to travel over city gravel roads to get to MCDOT gravel roads to do that grading. The city operates street sweepers on a daily basis with a service level of sweeping every street once every two months but MCDOT has to contract out to sweep streets that are near their rights-of-way (ROW). Exchanging these services is just one example of how each agency maintains their expected service level with a more efficient use of personnel and equipment through the Entente Agreement.

FISCAL ANALYSIS:

The agreement allows for a maximum value of \$250,000 for exchanged services each year. The only cost to Goodyear other than staff time is a payment for services provided by MCDOT that exceed the value of services provided by Goodyear. Goodyear and MCDOT have revised the scope of the services as needed each year in order to minimize out of pocket cost to either agency. For FY 16, Goodyear owed MCDOT \$763.40 when final costs were reconciled. Any costs for services owed to MCDOT will be funded out of the Street Maintenance operating budget.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of this intergovernmental agreement.
