5.1 Subcommittee Updates

Public Art:

- -Chairman Driscoll was elected as the Public Art Subcommittee chair.
- -Centennial Trail Project moving along, a 5' mosaic compass will be set at the centennial trailhead for direction.
- -Library Project nearing completion, the book return will be placed in a new location and library will be asked to vote for the quote that will be sandblasted into the concrete.
- -Banner Project received positive feedback, the public enjoys seeing the artistic banners, and residents even have requested copies of the banners.

Events and Festivals:

-Informed of upcoming events, Ballet under the Stars, September 30; Art of Cultures Expo, October 14; and Chark Art in the Park, November 4.

Community Outreach:

-Nothing to report, subcommittee meeting on April 24, was cancelled due to no quorum.

Goodyear Lakeside Music Fest Wrap-Up:

- -Goodyear Lakeside Music Fest was a success, over 7,000 attendees, 12 music genres, 46 youth performers, 100 VIPS, 36 volunteers, & 633 scoops ice cream served.
- -New addition to the music fest, VIP tent, very well received and utilized.
- -West Valley Art Council sent a thank you letter to Coordinator Ozlanski thanking the commission for the sponsorship, partnership, and support.

6. NEW BUSINESS

6.1 Chairman Remarks

Chairman Kaino expressed her appreciation and gratitude to the commissioners for their continued commitment to the Arts & Culture Commission, city of Goodyear, and each other. Kaino reflected on the many accomplishments, sees good momentum, and looks forward to continued success. Kaino shared her take away from the retreat stating that it's okay to disagree and have different points of view and the commissioners should not worry if everyone does not agree on everything. Kaino stated this is a diverse group with many different ideas which makes it even more interesting to test viewpoints and come out with good ideas.

6.3 Fiscal Year (FY) 18 Public Art Plan

-Review plan that will be presented to Council for approval.

Coordinator Ozlanski handed out the FY18 Public Art Plan packet that Council will also receive at the Council meeting. Ozlanski reviewed the entire Public Art Plan with the commissioners and stated that she will present with Chairman Kaino on May 8, for approval.

The FY 18 projects and budget are as follows:

Mobile Museum - 5,000

Fire Station 186 - 40,000

Fire Station 181 - 40,000

Goodyear Community Park - 20,000

Art Design Recreation Campus - 50,000

Traffic Cabinets (up to 5 cabinets) - 3,000 per cabinet (Traffic Signal Asset Management) Total of \$155,000 of projects in FY 18 to develop.

Coordinator Ozlanski stated that she feels optimistic about the FY 18 budget approval. Ozlanski also stated that recognition for the Millenium High School students that took the photos at City Hall will be receiving awards at the council meeting.

6.4 Commission Subcommittees Discussion

- -Vote on Community Outreach to remain one committee or be divided into two separate committees.
- -Number of committee members on subcommittees.

Chairman Kaino opened the discussion of the Community Outreach Subcommittee destiny and how the commission wants to move forward with this subcommittee.

After interactive discussion, the commissioners agreed to dissolve the Community Outreach Subcommittee and make two separate subcommittees. The commissioners also appointed committee members to the new subcommittees and voted accordingly.

Public Art Banners:

-Vice Mayor Lauritano suggested displaying the banners artwork on exhibit. Coordinator Ozlanski will coordinate with the artists and planning to hold an Artist Reception.

Centennial Trail Discs:

-Trail discs installation late May or early June.

Library Gathering Space:

-Library Project installation completion on June 2.
