# Wireless Communications in City Right-of-Way



## Definitions and Explanations

- Small Wireless Facility (SWF) equipment
- House Bill 2365
  - Allows SWF providers to install/operate in rights-of-way
  - Permits the city to charge a rate or fee for rights-of-way use
  - Limits application fee to \$750
- Proposed rates and fees are in accordance with State law

Utilities	SWF located within RoW	Wireless Providers	Accumulation of separate dry utility fees totaling \$849; exceeding the total SWF fees allowable under A.R.S. 9-595(L)(I)	\$750 SWF Total Application Fee for Permits, Review and Inspection
