



 32.6 acres (30 acres in design now)

## **SOUTH**

#### **Fire**

- 12k sq. ft. building
- 2 vehicles

#### **Parks**

- 17 acres (demand is 20.5 acres)
  - Foothills Community park expansion

- Estrella and Cotton Lane intersection

  - Proportionate share of odor control

## Economic Development Program

- Develop incentive based program
  - Flexible, adaptable
- Use FY2019 budgeted funding for retail impact fee reduction program as seed funding
  - To address potential needs in FY2019
- Pursue one-time funding in FY2020 and future budget processes consistent with potential need
