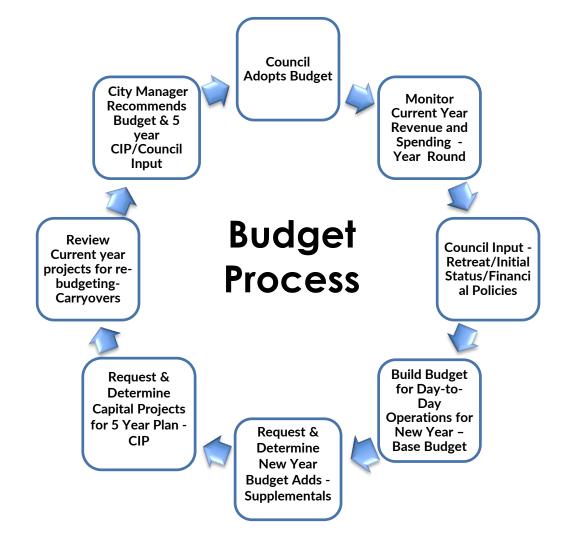

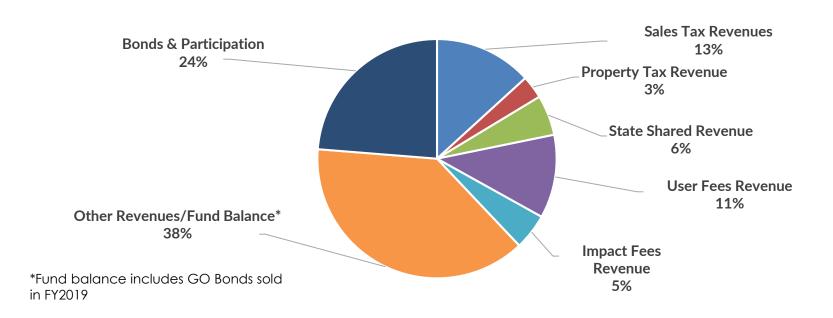

## Resource Assumptions



- No sales tax rate changes
- State shared revenues are per AZ League of Cities
  - No population adjustment reflected
- Development related revenues aligned with ongoing costs
- HURF and Ballpark Operating costs above revenues paid from General Fund
- Water and Wastewater rates change in January 2020 per adopted fiveyear plan
- Enterprise funds pay for general administration and in-lieu property tax

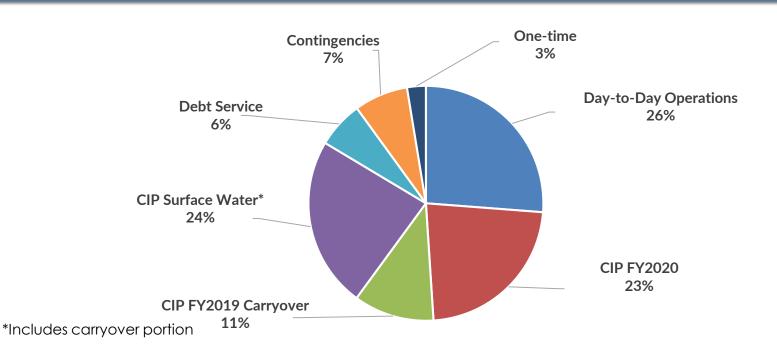

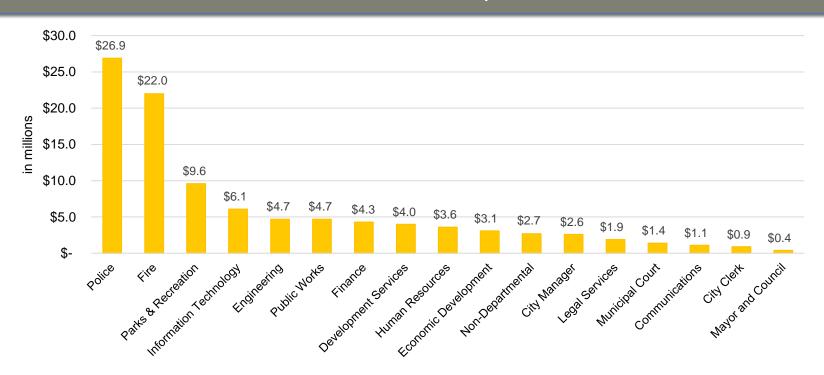
#### WHERE THE MONEY GOES



### FY2020 Day-to-Day Operating Budget



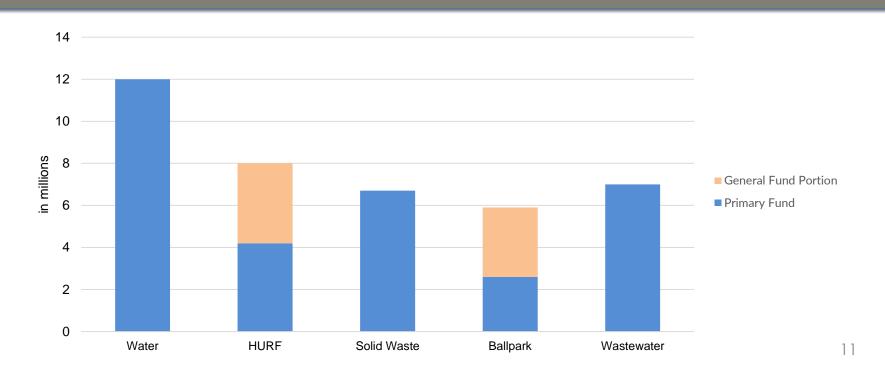
#### **GENERAL FUND ONLY BY DEPARTMENT - \$100 MILLION**

# Changes To City Manager's Recommended Budget



#### **OPERATING BUDGET**

- Additions
  - Supervisor one-time position in Court (4/15/2019 feedback)
  - Bullard Wash grass and maintenance (Civic Square related)
    - McDowell to Virginia; Over seed Monte Vista to McDowell only
  - One-time liability insurance rebate revenue added
- Removed electric charging station at GMC
  - FY2019 pilot project not fully implemented
  - Reconsider with Civic Square project timing
- Carryover of the cost allocation and user fee study

# Changes To City Manager's Recommended Budget



#### CIP

- Combined two streets projects in error
- Change planned traffic signals due to development
  - Eliminate carryover of Perryville & Indian School
  - Add Camelback and Sarival
- Revise city hall repairs to only most essential; savings to Civic Square reserve
- Update carryovers
  - Actual to-date FY2019 spending update
  - Miscellaneous revisions (eliminate cost estimator carryover, missing carryovers)



### FY2020 Tentative Budget Highlights

#### **POSITIONS**

- Adds 35.8 positions for a total of 679.8 (corrected from 4/15/2019 City Manager's Proposed Budget for Fire part-time conversion to full-time noted in discussion)
  - 639 full-time
  - 40.8 part-time full-time equivalents
- Salary and benefits
  - Fire represented 5% step/lump sum & 1.5% market
  - Police represented 5% step/lump sum & 2.5% market for police officer rank
  - All other employee groups 4% merit/lump sum
  - No change in cost of health benefits to employee or city



### FY2020 Tentative Budget Highlights

#### **KEY ADDITIONS AND PROJECTS**

#### Positions

- 6 sworn police positions for neighborhood, homeless outreach, and investigations
- 4.8 police and fire support positions
- 7 positions for development related
- 6.8 positions for Enterprise fund operations

#### Capital Projects

- 2 fire stations
- Recreation campus
- Continue the surface water project

# Capital Projects



- \$100,000 or more
  - New facilities, remodel/expand existing
  - Infrastructure such as streets, water lines
  - Major technology systems
  - Studies supporting to developing capital projects
  - Including asset management: specialty vehicles, ROW
- All impact fee funded restricted to capital

### CIP Process



- Departments prepared scopes and initial cost estimates
  - Cost estimating service used
- Engineering, Budget and Procurement reviews
- Executive Team reviews

## Capital Project Timelines



- Identified by departments
- Review and recommendations by Budget, Engineering, Procurement, Executive Team
- Project Planned Completion
  - Project operational date
  - Some are ongoing such as reimbursements
  - Debt service, payments, bi-annual audit
