She advised that there were 41 applications for a total of \$309,873, with 15 being first time applicants. The recommendations disbursed \$130,000 to 23 agencies.

# 16 <u>2019-6643</u> <u>AMENDMENT SEVEN TO THE IGA WITH THE REGIONAL PUBLIC</u> <u>TRANSIT AUTHORITY FOR THE CONTINUED PROVISION OF</u> TRANSIT SERVICES AND RELATED FY2020 BUDGET TRANSFER

Ms. Christine McMurdy, Administrative Services Supervisor, presented information to the Council regarding the Transit Services Agreement Amendment with the Regional Public Transit Authority. She also addressed the need to transfer funds in the amount of \$21,000 to cover the costs. She spoke about the increased ZOOM service that Goodyear will have beginning in October along Indian School Road and combining the north and south ZOOM routes. Ms. McMurdy added that Valley Metro will have all the service beginning in July rather than Valley Metro and the city of Phoenix splitting the service.

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# 17 <u>2019-6654</u> <u>APPROVE UNIFORM VIDEO SERVICE LICENSE AGREEMENT,</u> APPLICATION AND AFFIDAVIT FORM

Ms. Linda Beals, Real Estate Coordinator, spoke about the changes required by recent legislation including that Council needed to adopt the application, affidavit and license agreements for cable services. She added that currently the City had two providers of cable services, Cox Communications and CenturyLink. She added that there is a 10 year limit on the initial lease and that the city could only ever receive 5% of the gross revenues of the applicant, which will include sales tax and in-kind services.

Council asked if this would impact when the provider did any roadwork, getting them to put the streets into their original condition. Ms. Beals responded that they would still be required to do permitted work and to put the roadways back to their original condition.

Council asked what recourse the city would have when there were complaints. Ms. Beals responded that, under the new law, the city had no authority to act; however, the city could assist in collecting complaints to turn over to the FCC.
