2. Parks and Recreation Department Update (David Seid, Parks and Recreation Manager)

Chairman See joined the meeting at 5:44pm.

Commissioner Rice joined the meeting at 5:45pm.

Parks and Recreation Manager David Seid provided an update on the new Goodyear Recreation Campus. The Campus, which is expected to be complete in the summer of 2021, will serve as a gathering place for the community. He explained that the Campus will consist of a 30-acre community park, recreation center and aquatics center. The Park will have multipurpose fields, playgrounds, baseball/softball fields, sport courts, picnic areas and interactive public art. The recreation center will have a gymnasium, activity rooms, fitness area, indoor walking/running track, and a dedicated teen room. The aquatic area will include a 25-yard lap pool, play pool with zero-depth entry and play structure, a lazy river, and two slides.

Vice Chair Lauritano asked if the pool would be used in partnership with high schools to host swim competitions or other events.

Mr. Seid mentioned that the city already partners with schools at Loma Linda pool and supports the YMCA pool. He noted that the city was not looking to compete with the YMCA or other programs and would complement the existing resources in the city.

Assistant to the Council John Raeder asked if there would be opportunities for the Commission to contribute to the youth area in the new recreation center.

Mr. Seid responded that Parks and Recreation would love to work with the Commission to program the space and explained that the city was already implementing a very successful e-gaming program targeted at youth and suggested it might be an opportunity for collaboration.

3. Make a Difference Day (John Raeder, Assistant to the Council)

Mr. Raeder explained that the City of Goodyear would be participating in Make a Difference Day on Saturday, October 24. Make a Difference Day is a national day of community service in which residents and organization contribute to improving their community. Mr. Raeder noted that last year the Commission painted the foursquare area at Desert Star Elementary School and asked Commissioners if they had any ideas or recommendations for a project this year.

Commissioners discussed several ideas, including: volunteering at the food pantry; conducting a city-wide drive for Homeless Youth Connection; hosting a Halloween costume contest on social media; and hosting a chalk-walk with positive messages.

Mr. Raeder noted that the most common theme of the discussion was helping a food bank and/or conducing a food drive. He indicated that he would follow-up with the local food banks to explore a project for Make a Difference Day.

4. Goals and Projects (John Raeder, Assistant to the Council)

Mr. Raeder led a discussion with the Commission on projects and goals for the year.

Commissioners recommended that the Youth Commission host a virtual Cookies, Cocoa and Convo event to focus on youth mental well being; build a community garden; plan a youth mural project; conduct a drive for the Homeless Youth Connection; and work with Digital Communications to promote youth content on social media.
